Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:

Irvine Ranch Water District (IRWD) owns and operates the existing Shallow Groundwater Unit (SGU) treatment facility located on the former Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) El Toro near Marine Way, in Irvine, CA. The SGU is part of the Irvine Desalter Project, which is an on-going groundwater cleanup project being undertaken by IRWD, the Orange County Water District, and the Department of the Navy to remove volatile organic compounds (VOCs) from 43 Department of the Navy extraction wells located within the boundary of the former MCAS El Toro site.

Water from the SGU is treated through air strippers, and the off-gas from the air strippers is treated through vapor phase granular-activated carbon (GAC) to remove the VOCs. Treated water from the SGU is pumped into the South Irvine Brine Line, which conveys the water to the South Orange County Wastewater Authority (SOCWA) pump station, located at IRWD's Los Alisos Water Recycling Plant, where the treated water is pumped again to the SOCWA ocean outfall.

Per-and polyfluoroalkyl substance (PFAS) compounds have emerged as contaminants of concern primarily due to human health impacts. Elevated levels of PFAS compounds have been detected in the water delivered to SGU. While the SGU treatment facility effectively removes VOC compounds from the water, it is unable to remove PFAS compounds.

This project will replace the existing treatment system with a new liquid phase GAC treatment system that is capable of effectively removing both VOCs and PFAS compounds from the water. The new treatment system will have substantially the same capacity as the treatment system being replaced. While the majority of the project will be constructed within the limits of the existing facility, a new potable water pipeline that will serve the site will be constructed from Marine way to the site.

Reasons why project is exempt:

State Guideline §15301 provides exemption for the operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing at the time of the lead agency's determination. State Guideline §15302 consists of replacement of existing utility systems and/or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of capacity. This project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as authorized under State Guidelines §15301, 15302 and 15303. The facility will have the same purpose and will replace the existing treatment system at the SGU with a

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new treatment system so that it can effectively remove both PFAS and VOCs.


