IRWD WATER LOSS AUDIT REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019-20

SUMMARY:

Each year, urban retail water suppliers are required to submit a validated Water Loss Audit Report to the California Department of Water Resources (DWR). The data reported by the suppliers serves as baseline data to inform the State Water Resources Control Board in the development of water loss performance standards in 2021. Provided below is a summary of the IRWD Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-20 validated Water Loss Audit results.

BACKGROUND:

IRWD first implemented water loss control programs in 1991 with the introduction of proactive leak detection and meter replacement programs. In 2017, water loss prevention and revenue recovery were added to the program portfolio. This suite of programs minimizes leakage from the IRWD distribution system, limits water theft, ensures accuracy in customer billing and demonstrates IRWD's commitment to responsible resource management. The positive impact of the District's water loss control programs is evident in the Water Loss Audit results. IRWD audit results consistently report low levels of water loss because of the District's long history of implementing water loss programs and access to high quality data.

State of California Requirements:

In 2015, California Senate Bill 555 was enacted. State law now requires that each urban retail water supplier submit a third-party-validated Water Loss Audit Report to DWR. The submission deadline for FY 2019-20 reporting is January 1, 2021. Data from the reports submitted by the urban retail water suppliers will serve as baseline data to inform the State Board in the development of water loss performance standards that are expected to be adopted in 2021.

IRWD's Water Loss Audit:

Staff recently prepared IRWD's validated FY 2019-20 Water Loss Audit Report for submittal to DWR. The Water Loss Audit Report was prepared by a multi-disciplinary team of IRWD staff utilizing the audit procedures outlined in the American Water Works Association (AWWA) M36 Water Audits and Loss Control Programs Manual and associated software. The M36 procedures call for estimating total water losses that are comprised of two categories: Real Losses and Apparent Losses. Real Losses include leaks, line breaks and overflows that occur anywhere in the distribution system upstream of customer meters. Apparent Losses include unauthorized use of water, metering inaccuracies and systematic data handling errors. The IRWD FY 2019-20 Water Loss Audit Report is provided as Exhibit "A". The corresponding third-party validation certificate prepared by consultants at Water Systems Optimization is provided as Exhibit "B".

Overview of Performance Indicators:

The water loss audit provides a basic water balance and several performance indicators for the reporting period. These indicators include the Infrastructure Leakage Index (ILI), Real and Apparent Losses as well as a percentage of non-revenue water, and a data validity grade. These indicators are explained in more detail below.

Infrastructure Leakage Index:

The Infrastructure Leakage Index is calculated as follows:

$$\text{Infrastructure Leakage Index} = \frac{\text{Current Annual Real Losses}}{\text{Unavoidable Annual Real Losses}}$$

A perfect ILI score is 1.00 indicating a very tight potable water distribution system with loss volumes that are equal to the Unavoidable Annual Real Losses. These unavoidable losses are calculated for each system and represent a minimum level of leakage expected based on the size of system, pressure and number of connections.

Real and Apparent Losses and Non-Revenue Water:

Two metrics are used to report on real loss. One is total current annual Real Losses, which varies based on the size of the utility and other factors. The second metric is gallons per connection per day, which helps to normalize the results. Apparent Loss is reported as a total volume and on a per connection per day basis. Non-revenue water includes both Real and Apparent Losses. It is represented as a percentage of the total potable supply and as a percentage of the total operating costs.

Data Validity Grade:

All data that are entered into the AWWA Water Loss Audit report software are evaluated and assigned a Data Validity Grade. The Data Validity Grade is a measure of audit data accuracy and ranges from zero to 100, with a score of 100 representing the highest level achievable. The scale does not represent 100 being the best because there are measures that would improve a utility's Data Validity Grade but may not actually save water, may not be cost-effective or simply may not be appropriate for the utility.

IRWD's Water Loss Audit Results:

Agencies with aggressive water loss control programs such as IRWD can expect an ILI close to the technical minimum value of 1.0, provided the data used in reporting are valid. An ILI value less than 1.0 is not typically realistic based on the unavoidable leakage calculated for the system. As shown in the table below, IRWD's ILI for FY 2019-20 is 1.19, compared with 0.79 in FY 2018-19.

Comparison to Previous Year:

IRWD’s ILI for FY 2019-20 is 1.19, which is higher than 0.79 in FY 2018-19. This difference is due to several accuracy improvements in the District’s data. The table below compares FY 2018-19 and FY 2019-20 key water loss performance indicators:

Staff has streamlined the annual water loss reporting process by improving the data collection and interdepartmental data transfer process. Staff intends to revise reports from the previous two fiscal years utilizing improved reporting accuracy and better understanding of the water audit process. Staff will then have the reports re-validated by a third party and resubmit the revised reports to DWR.

OVER-ALLOCATION WATER USE AND OUTREACH UPDATE

SUMMARY:

COVID-19 has led to the closure of many businesses and schools causing many customers to work and learn from home. Staff has been analyzing water use data to ensure that customer water budget allocations are sufficient to meet increased indoor needs. Following is an overview of staff's water use analysis as well as a new focused outreach effort to assist residential customers who may be experiencing over-allocation water use as a result of COVID-19.

BACKGROUND:

COVID-19 has forced many IRWD customers to work and learn from home, resulting in increased residential indoor water use. Staff has been monitoring and analyzing water use patterns to ensure that IRWD's water budget allocations are designed to meet increased efficient customer water use needs. Staff has been providing temporary variances that account for an increased number of residents in households affected by COVID-19.

Over-allocation Water Use Analysis:

An analysis of customer over-allocation water use for the third quarter of Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-20 is provided as Exhibit "A". This exhibit compares the number of over-allocation accounts for the same quarter in FY 2019-20 and FY 2020-21. The analysis demonstrates that there have been minor changes in the number or percentage of over-allocation landscape irrigation accounts. The analysis also depicts that residential accounts have increased in over-allocation water use with apartments showing the greatest increase compared to the previous year. The increases in residential over-allocation use are likely due to changes in indoor use. Staff has observed that this effect is more noticeable during late summer and early fall than during spring and early summer when cool weather often results in underwatering of landscapes. This underwatering provides an overall usage "buffer" for increased indoor use by residential customers.

Customer Outreach:

Customer outreach is foundational to IRWD's water efficiency program efforts. Each month, staff proactively contacts customers in the over-allocation tiers to offer assistance. The District also sends approximately 48,000 custom water use reports to over-allocation customers. These reports compare customers' actual water use to their budget and peer group. The reports also promote the District's Water Efficiency programs. Most of these reports are sent through electronic mail and average a 52% open rate. In addition to the monthly reports, staff sends Leak Alert notices to customers with use indicative of a water leak. The Leak Alerts have a specific message and instructions to assist customers with addressing potential leaks.

New Focused Outreach:

Staff is implementing new focused outreach efforts designed to further address over-allocation water use. The new efforts will model the successful Leak Alert approach using the WaterSmart Program Group Messenger feature. The following strategies will be used to target customers as follows:

- An analysis of each customer's historical water use will be used to determine the most likely cause of over-allocation use;
- Each group of customers will receive a tailored outreach message to draw attention to the possible cause and remedy for their over-allocation use;
- Different messages can be sent to customers who are likely over-irrigating and customers who may need a permanent variance or temporary COVID-19 variance for increased indoor water use; and
- The outreach will direct customers to the District's self-help resources and where needed, staff will provide one-on-one assistance to help ensure all customers have an appropriate water budget that is based on need.

The new focused outreach will be rolled out in phases. The customer outreach groups will be prioritized based on the greatest volume of over-allocation water use. The outreach will then be scaled up or down to ensure a positive customer experience with respect to the District's response to their needs. This focused outreach will be coordinated with other planned outreach to avoid overwhelming customers with multiple emails. A paper-oriented approach to the outreach may be pursued for customers without valid e-mail addresses or if there is a low response rate from the electronic mail outreach.

2020 LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY UPDATE

SUMMARY:

This report provides an update on the 2019-2020 legislative session and IRWD priorities. As legislation and regulations develop, staff will provide updates and recommendations to the Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee and the Board, as appropriate. Staff recommends that the Board receive and file the report.

BACKGROUND:

The State Legislature has recessed and will reconvene to begin the 2021-2022 legislative session on December 7, 2020. Congress has recessed until after the November 2 election. At this time, the United State Senate is schedule to return from its recess on November 9, 2020, and the United States House of Representatives is scheduled to return on November 16.

2020 State Legislative Update:

Legislation Related to Fees on Residential Housing Developments:

One of the prominent topics of discussion during the 2019 legislative year was the lack of affordable housing in California. At the end of the 2019 legislative year, the discussion on housing affordability turned to the fees assessed on new housing developments. The discussion on fees was spurred by a report issued by the University of California, Berkeley’s Turner Center— the “[Residential Impact Fees In California: Current Practices and Policy Considerations to Improve Implementation of Fees Governed by the Mitigation Fee Act](#),” (the “Turner Study”).

After the release of the Turner Study, Assemblymember Timothy Grayson (D-Concord) amended [AB 1484](#) to propose a number of changes to the laws governing fees charged to new housing developments, including connection fees. At the time, staff engaged with IRWD’s associations and industry partners to seeks the removal of connections fees from the scope of AB 1484; however, the 2019 legislative year ended before Assemblymember Grayson could work on AB 1484 further.

Over the 2019 fall legislative recess, Assemblymember Grayson held a series of roundtables throughout the state to gather information on the fees charged on new residential housing developments. Following that effort, on February 24, 2020, Assemblymember Grayson, in conjunction with Assemblymembers David Chiu (D-San Francisco), Rob Bonta (D-Oakland),

Todd Gloria (D-San Diego), and Jesse Gabriel (D-San Fernando Valley) held a press conference announcing a package of eight bills meant to address development fees on housing developments. Several of the eight bills would have impacted connection fees. Those eight bills did not move forward in 2020.

Over the past month, Assemblymember Grayson restarted discussions on the fees assessed on new housing development, including connections fees. He has put together a stakeholder working group to discuss proposals regarding these fees and how they are set. During the last stakeholder working group meeting, it was announced that the Turner Center was preparing to release a new report on development impact fees and the other fees charged to new housing developments. The focus of the new report is said to be on the nexus studies uses to justify the amount of the fees charged.

Once Assemblymember Grayson called together the new round of stakeholder meetings, staff engaged with IRWD's associations and industry partners to again seek the removal of connections fees from the scope of the Assemblymember's proposals. Staff will provide an update to the Committee on any new developments related to connection fees, the new Turner Center report, and Assemblymember Grayson's proposals.

2020 State Regulatory Update:

The following is a list of some of the State regulations and agency reports staff is monitoring, tracking or planning to engage in over the next three to 12 months. As the next drafts of the regulations or report are released for public review and comment, staff will engage, as appropriate. Staff will also provide an oral update to the Committee on any new developments related to these regulations. The pending regulations and reports actively being tracked include:

- California Air Resources Board's Advanced Clean Fleets Regulations;
- California Air Resources Board's Air Toxics "Hot Spot"/Criteria Pollutant and Toxics Emissions Reporting Regulations;

- Implementation of the Governor's Water Resiliency Portfolio;
- State Board's development of a "Cross Connection Policy Handbook;"
- State Board's Electronic Annual Report;
- State Board's Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resilience (SFER) Drinking Water Program;
- State Board's [water loss performance standards regulations](#);

- State Board’s “Water Quality Control Plan for Inland Surface Waters, Enclosed Bays, and Estuaries of California” and draft “Toxicity Provisions;” and
- Updates to the Plumbing Code.

2020 Federal Update:

IRWD’s federal advocacy efforts in 2020 continue to largely focus on seeking federal funding for the Kern Fan Groundwater Storage Project and advocating for an increased funding authorization for the federal Water Storage Program. As the nation’s attention has shifted to COVID-19, staff and the District’s advocates have been tracking the federal legislation dealing with the coronavirus. Staff also continues to track federal legislation related to infrastructure funding. Staff will update the Committee on these efforts and will update the Committee on the ongoing efforts related to positioning the Kern Fan Groundwater Storage Project for federal funding this year.

2021-2022 IRWD LOBBYING AND ADVOCACY SERVICES

SUMMARY:

Irvine Ranch Water District's current 24-month contracts with Kadesh & Associates for Federal lobbying and consulting services, with The Oñate Group and Quintana, Watts & Hartmann, which has organized as Resolute for State legislative lobbying and consulting services, and Cliff Moriyama Consulting for State regulatory agency lobbying and consulting services will expire on December 31, 2020. Each of these firms has provided a high level of service, knowledge, credibility and access to the federal and state officials and agencies they engage with on behalf of the District. Based on their qualifications and strategic ability to influence policy decisions, staff recommends entering into new 24-month agreements with each of these firms for the 2021-2022 legislative sessions.

BACKGROUND:

IRWD continues to be a leader in water resources public policy and governance. During 2019 and 2020, the District engaged in a number of federal and state policy discussions regarding water infrastructure, supply reliability and governance. The District was assisted in these discussions by both its federal and state lobbyists and consultants.

Many of the policy discussions are expected to carry over into the 2021-2022 legislative sessions. Entering into 24-month contracts with Kadesh & Associates, The Oñate Group, Resolute, and Cliff Moriyama Consulting will allow the District to maintain continuity in its Washington, D.C. and Sacramento representation throughout the 2021-2022 sessions.

Federal Lobbyist and Advocate:

Kadesh & Associates provides the District with a high level of service, knowledge, credibility and access in Washington, D.C. Additionally, Kadesh & Associates assists the District in ongoing efforts to build and maintain relationships with key policy makers in Congress, the Administration and within federal agencies.

To aid IRWD in its federal advocacy efforts, staff recommends the Board authorize the execution of new Professional Services Agreements with Kadesh & Associates for a 24-month period, beginning January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2022. The new contract would each include a \$10,200 monthly retainer plus reimbursement of reasonable direct expenses for a total amount not to exceed \$265,000. The proposed new agreement reflects a two percent increase in the amount of the monthly retainer, but not an increase in the total contract amount.

State Legislative Lobbyist and Advocate:

The Oñate Group and Resolute provide the District with a high level of service, knowledge, credibility and access in Sacramento. Additionally, The Oñate Group and Resolute assist the District in ongoing efforts to build and maintain relationships with key policy makers in the Governor's Office and the Legislature.

To aid IRWD in its State advocacy efforts, the General Manager, within his authority, will execute a new sole-source Professional Services Agreement with The Oñate Group and with Resolute for a 24-month period, beginning January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2022. The new contracts would each include a \$5,150 monthly retainer plus reimbursement of reasonable direct expenses for a total amount not to exceed \$128,750. The proposed new agreement reflects a three percent increase in the amount of the monthly retainer or the total contract amount.

State Regulatory Lobbyist and Advocate:

Cliff Moriyama Consulting provides the District with a high level of service, knowledge, credibility and access in Sacramento. Additionally, Cliff Moriyama Consulting assists the District in ongoing efforts to build and maintain relationships with key policy makers in the Governor's Office and State agencies.

To aid IRWD in its State advocacy efforts, the General Manager, within his authority, will execute a new sole-source Professional Services Agreement with Cliff Moriyama Consulting for a 24-month period, beginning January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2022. The new contract would include a \$4,000 monthly retainer plus reimbursement of reasonable direct expenses for a total contract amount not to exceed \$100,000. The proposed new agreement reflects no increase in the amount of the monthly retainer or the total contract amount.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

The current contracts with Kadesh & Associates, The Oñate Group, Resolute, and Cliff Moriyama Consulting expire on December 31, 2020. Cumulatively they are \$24,000 per month plus reimbursement of reasonable direct expenses. The current contract is for a 24-month term and has a not-to-exceed value of \$615,000.

The proposed contract with Kadesh & Associates, The Oñate Group, Resolute, and Cliff Moriyama Consulting would be effective from January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2022, and is proposed at a cumulative amount of \$24,500 per month plus reimbursement of reasonable direct expenses. If approved by the Board, the new contract will be charged against the FY 2020-2021, FY 2021-2022 and FY 2022-2023 Operating Budgets. The total requested contract authorization is \$622,500.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE:

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board authorize the General Manager to execute a Professional Services Agreement with Kadash & Associates for federal advocacy services for the period of January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2022, at a rate of \$10,200 per month plus reasonable reimbursement of direct expenses for a total contract amount not to exceed \$265,000.
