2022 LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY UPDATE

SUMMARY:

This report provides an update on the 2021-2022 legislative session, regulatory issues, and IRWD priorities. As legislation and regulations develop, staff will provide updates and recommendations to the Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee and the Board, as appropriate. Staff recommends the Board receive and file this report.

BACKGROUND:

On August 11, 2022, the Senate and Assembly Appropriations Committees both held their respective Suspense File hearing. The Senate Appropriations Committee acted on 491 bills. The committee passed 368 bills and held 123 bills on suspense. The Assembly Appropriations Committee acted on 323 bills. The committee passed 244 bills and held 79 bills on suspense.

The Suspense File hearings marked the beginning of the final two weeks of the 2021-2022 legislative session. It began with 639 active measures on the Senate floor and 378 active measures on the Assembly floor. August 25, 2022 was the last day to amend bills on the floor, and August 31 is the last day for the Legislature to pass bills during the regular session.

A copy of the 2022 Legislative Matrix is provided as Exhibit "A". Links to the bills discussed below are included with each discussion unless a separate exhibit is noted.

California's Water Supply Strategy: Adapting to a Hotter, Drier Future:

On August 11, 2022, Governor Newsom released "<u>California's Water Supply Strategy: Adapting to a Hotter, Drier Future.</u>" The document is a follow-up to his Water Resilience Portfolio. While the Portfolio outlines a larger number of actions needed to build water resiliency for California, the Strategy "outlines California's strategy and priority actions to adapt and protect water supplies in an era of rising temperatures," and focuses on the statement that "California could lose 10 percent of its water supplies" over the next 20 years. Specifically, the Strategy calls for:

- Recycling and reusing at least 800,000 acre-feet of water per year by 2030 and 1.8 million acre-feet by 2040;
- Expanding brackish groundwater desalination production by 28,000 acre-feet per year by 2030 and 84,000 acre-feet per year by 2040 and helping guide location of seawater desalination projects "where they are cost effective and environmentally appropriate";
- Expanding average annual groundwater recharge by at least 500,000 acre-feet;

- Working with local proponents to complete the seven Proposition 1-supported storage projects (includes the Kern Fan Groundwater Storage Project) and considering funding other viable surface storage projects;
- Expanding San Luis Reservoir by 135,000 acre-feet;
- Rehabilitating dams to regain storage capacity;
- Supporting local stormwater capture projects with the goal of increasing annual supply capacity by at least 250,000 acre-feet by 2030 and 500,000 acre-feet by 2040;
- Reducing annual urban water demand by at least 500,000 acre-feet by 2030;
- Helping to stabilize groundwater supplies;
- Improving data collection and adjusting forecasts for climate change;
- Improving conveyance, including Delta conveyance; and
- Modernizing water rights administration for equity, access, flexibility, and transparency.

2022 State Legislative Update:

SB 222 (Dodd, D-Napa) – Water Rate Assistance Program:

SB 222 would establish a permanent California low-income water and wastewater rate assistance program (WRAP), administered by the State Water Resources Control Board. As discussed previously with the Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee, June 23, 2022, amendments largely took the bill back to where the bill was before IRWD and others removed their opposition to the bill last year. The author amended the bill on August 11, 2022, resolving some of IRWD's concerns with the bill, but several significant problematic provisions remained. The bill was amended again on August 24, 2022, with additional amendments to further address some of the concerns of IRWD and water community. Despite these amendments, the bill still did not clearly place the responsibility for enrolling Californians with the State Board, along with other requested changes. As of the writing of this report, the bill is on the Assembly Floor. IRWD has an "oppose unless amended" position on the bill.

SB 361 (Umberg, D-Santa Ana) – Surplus Land: City of Anaheim:

SB 361 would have required, until January 1, 2030, the County of Orange and any city located within Orange County, if notified by HCD that its planned sale of surplus land is in violation of the Surplus Land Act, to cure or correct the alleged violation within 60 days. A jurisdiction that had not cured or corrected an alleged violation within 60 days would be prohibited from disposing of the parcel until the department deemed the alleged violation not to be a violation. Staff sought amendments that would remove all references to leases from the bill, and on August 15, 2022, the bill was amended to narrow the bill's applicability to the City of Anaheim and to remove the final remaining reference to leases from the bill. Later that week, the author opted not to continue to move the bill and on August 18, 2022, the bill was ordered to the Assembly Inactive File.

SB 1157 (Hertzberg, D-Van Nuys) – Indoor Residential Water Use Standard:

SB 1157 would lower the indoor residential water use standard, as recommended to the Legislature jointly by the Department of Water Resources (DWR) and the State Board. Specifically, SB 1157 would modify the indoor residential water use standards as follows:

Time Frame	Existing Standard	Proposed Standard
Until January 1, 2025	55 gallons per capita daily (gpcd)	55 gpcd
January 1, 2025 – January 1, 2030	52.5 gpcd	47 gpcd
After January 1, 2030	50 gpcd	42 gpcd

The bill was last amended on August 25, 2022. Those amendments included:

- A new component to the study the DWR is required to conduct, including the requirement that DWR must consider and incorporate other studies quantifying impacts on water, wastewater, and recycled water systems, and evaluate the long-term effects of telework;
- Changing the due date for the study from January 1, 2027, to October 1, 2028;
- A requirement that the determination for a delayed implementation of the 2030 standard due to impacts to affordability now needs to be based on two years of data reflecting the implementation of the 2025 standard;
- A change in the variance language to permit DWR to consider recommending variances to the State Board, rather than the Board considering adoption them;
- Permissive language that DWR can recommend a variance to address adverse impacts to recycled water operations; and
- New language that explicitly states the indoor residential water standard is not separately enforceable.

While the last set of amendments enhance the bill's study provisions and add variances to reduce impacts to recycled water operations to the variance options, it does not ensure the protection of recycled water suppliers. As a result, IRWD currently has an "oppose" position on SB 1157 due to the unintended consequences the standard to 42 gpcd would have on the quality of IRWD's recycled water. As of the writing of this report, the bill is on the Assembly Floor.

Other 2022 State Bills of Interest:

As has been traditionally done at the end of the legislative session, staff has provided an update on others bills still active at the end of the legislative session and that were of interest to IRWD. A status report on each bill is provided below:

- AB 1817 (Ting, D-San Francisco) Textile Articles Containing Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS): AB 1817 would prohibit the manufacture, distribution, sale, or offering of any new, not previously owned textile article, as defined, that contains PFAS, beginning January 1, 2025. As of writing of this report, the bill is on the Senate Floor;
- AB 2106 (R. Rivas, D-Hollister) Water Quality Permits: AB 2106 would require the State Board to modernize its stormwater data collection systems and software, and establish a statewide commercial, industrial, and institutional (CII) NPDES order regulating stormwater and authorized non-stormwater discharges from facilities that are a significant contributor of pollutants to federally protected surface waters, as determined by the State Board. As of the writing of this report, the bill is on the Senate Floor;
- AB 2108 (R. Rivas, D-Hollister) Environmental Justice: Disadvantaged and Tribal Communities: AB 2108 would require that the State Board have at least one member qualified in the field of water supply and water quality relating to disadvantaged or tribal communities, and that each regional board have at least one person with specialized experience relating to disadvantaged or tribal communities. The bill would also require the State Board and each regional board to make a specified finding on potential environmental justice, tribal impact, and racial equity considerations when adopting water quality control plans or state policies for water quality control, and when issuing or reissuing waste discharge requirements or waivers of waste discharge requirements. As of the writing of this report, the bill is on the Senate Floor;
- AB 2142 (Gabriel, D-Encino) Turf Replacement Rebate Income Tax Exclusion: AB 2142 would provide a personal income tax and corporate tax exclusion for turf removal rebates, vouchers, or other financial incentives received by water customers between January 1, 2022, and January 1, 2027. IRWD currently has a "support" position on AB 2142. As of the writing of this report, the bill is on the Senate Floor;
- AB 2186 (Grayson, D-Concord) Housing Cost Reduction Incentive Program: AB 2186 would establish the Housing Cost Reduction Incentive Program, which would reimburse cities and counties for development impact fee reductions provided to qualified rental housing developments, and for the reasonable interest costs associated with impact fee deferrals. This bill was held on suspense in the Senate Appropriations Committee;
- AB 2247 (Bloom, D-Santa Monica) PFAS Products and Components Publicly Accessible Data Collection Interface: AB 2247 would require, on or before July 2025, PFAS products and product components containing intentionally-added PFAS to be registered on a publicly accessible data collection interface created by the Department of Toxic Substances Control and the Interstate Chemicals Clearinghouse. As of the writing of this report, the bill is on the Senate Floor;
- AB 2536 (Grayson, D-Concord) Impact Fee Nexus Studies: Connection Fees and Capacity Charges: AB 2536, as introduced, would have impacted IRWD's ability to set and charge cost-of-service-based connection fees, but this bill was amended to remove the proposed requirement for a local agency that imposes a fee or capacity charge to support the estimate of reasonable cost of providing service by following specified

standards and practices. IRWD's existing practices meet the amended bill's evaluation requirements. The Governor has signed this bill into law;

- SB 938 (Hertzberg, D-Van Nuys) Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Proceedings: SB 938, in addition to consolidating the protest threshold provisions in the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act, would establish a new voter protest threshold for LAFCO-initiated special district dissolutions under specified conditions. IRWD maintained a "support" position on SB 938. The Governor has signed this bill into law; and
- SB 1044 (Durazo, D-Los Angeles) Emergency Condition Employer Retaliation: SB 1044 would prohibit an employer from taking or threatening adverse action against any employee for refusing to report to, or leaving, a workplace or worksite because the employee has a reasonable belief that the workplace or worksite is unsafe. SB 1044 was amended on May 19, 2022, to exempt disaster service workers, among others. This bill is currently on the Senate Floor for a vote of concurrence in amendments; and
- Legislation Related to the Brown Act:
 - o AB 1944 (Lee, D-Milpitas) Local Agency Teleconferences: AB 1944 would allow members of a legislative body of a local agency to use teleconferencing without identifying each teleconference location in the notice and agenda of the meeting or proceeding, and without making each teleconference location accessible to the public, if at least a quorum of members of the legislative body participates from a single physical location. This bill was double referred to the Senate Governance and Finance Committee and Judiciary Committee and they did not receive a hearing by the deadline; and
 - o AB 2449 (B. Rubio, D-Baldwin Park) Local Agency Teleconferences: AB 2449 would allow, until January 1, 2026, members of a legislative body of a local agency to use teleconferencing without identifying each teleconference location in the notice and agenda of the meeting, and without making each teleconference location accessible to the public, if at least a quorum of the members of the body participates in person and other conditions are met. As of the writing of this report, the bill is on the Senate Floor.

2022 State and Regional Regulatory Update:

State Auditor Report and State Board Efforts on Safe Drinking Water for Failing Systems:

Following the creation of the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund by SB 200 (Monning, D-Carmel) of 2019, which provides up to \$130 million annually through 2030, the State Board established the Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resilience (SAFER) Program to assist water systems with short-term and long-term solutions for safe, adequate, and affordable drinking water.

The State Board establishes project funding priorities with an annual Fund Expenditure Plan, which is based on its Drinking Water Needs Assessment. In producing the Drinking Water Needs Assessment in 2021 and 2022, and as it works to develop the 2023 Drinking Water Needs

Assessment, the State Board has continued to update the criteria and modeling used in the several components, those being the Risk Assessment, Cost Assessment, and Affordability Assessment. In August, State Board staff hosted a public webinar on proposed updates to the drinking water cost assessment model and the first of three scheduled affordability workshops in 2022. The proposed new drinking water cost assessment model favors physical consolidation over other solutions, and State Board staff are continuing to consider pros and cons of various measures of affordability. Staff will continue to monitor the development of the 2023 Drinking Water Needs Assessment as State Board staff solicits stakeholder feedback.

On July 26, 2022, the California State Auditor released a report titled "<u>State Water Resources Control Board: It Lacks the Urgency Necessary to Ensure That Failing Water Systems Receive Needed Assistance in a Timely Manner,</u>" which is an audit of the Safe and Afford Drinking Water Fund and program. This report concludes that, while there is funding available for the State Board to help the more than 370 failing water systems throughout California, "the board has generally demonstrated a lack of urgency in providing this critical assistance." The report is critical of the State Board's lengthy and "cumbersome" funding application process for failing water systems and finds that there is insufficient communication and follow-up with water systems.

The State Board offers access to technical service providers for failing water systems that lack sufficient technical expertise for project development and that require assistance with funding applications, but the Auditor found that the State Board does not sufficiently monitor the performance of these providers. According to the report, projects become more expensive the longer it takes for the State Board to fund them, and funding delays increase the likelihood of negative health outcomes for Californians served by failing water systems. The State Board disagreed with some of the conclusions in the report, but generally accepted the recommendations and committed to working to implement them.

 - DWR's Work Group on CII performance measures; and
 - o State Board's Water Loss Performance Standards Regulations;

2022 Federal Legislative and Regulatory Update:

Kern Fan Groundwater Storage Project Outreach:

IRWD's federal advocacy efforts in 2022 continue to largely focus on seeking federal funding for the Kern Fan Groundwater Storage Project and advocating for an increased funding authorization for the federal Water Storage Program. Staff will provide an update on those efforts.

Inflation Reduction Act Drought Response and Preparedness Provisions:

H.R. 5376, known as the <u>Inflation Reduction Act of 2002</u>, and signed into law by President Joe Biden on August 16, 2022. The Act contains various funding provisions relating to climate change and other subjects and includes funding for drought response and preparedness. Specifically, the drought response and preparedness funding include:

• \$4 billion for activities to mitigate the impacts of drought in western states, with priority given to the Colorado River Basin and other basins experiencing comparable levels of long-term drought, to reduce water diversions, consumptive water use, and demand for water supplies, and for ecosystem and habitat restoration projects;

- \$550 million for disadvantaged communities for up to 100 percent of the cost of the planning, design, or construction of domestic water supply projects; and
- \$25 million for projects to cover water conveyance facilities with solar panels or for other solar projects that increase water efficiency and assist in implementation of clean energy goals.

RESUMPTION OF IRWD SHUTOFF POLICY UPDATE

SUMMARY:

After suspending its policy for discontinuing water service in March 2020 due to COVID-19, IRWD intends to resume this policy in its entirety by October 1, 2022. At the end of July, all customers with a delinquent balance were sent notification(s) of their past due amount(s) and were encouraged to enroll in a payment plan, if they are unable to pay their account(s) in full. In addition, IRWD has included messaging on customers' bills, the District's website, interactive voice response hold messaging, and in the *Pipelines* newsletter regarding the upcoming resumption of IRWD's shutoff policy. This write-up summarizes customers' responses, to date, to the resumption of IRWD's shutoff policy.

BACKGROUND:

At the onset of the COVID -19 pandemic in March 2020, IRWD temporarily suspended its policy to shut off water service for its customers for non-payment of past-due amounts (IRWD Rules & Regulations, Section 12.5). IRWD also suspended charging late fees and interest on past-due balances. At the end of July 2022, IRWD sent notifications to all delinquent accounts of its intent to resume its regular discontinuation of water service, and also offered to place each these customers on a payment plan. Customers were instructed on how to contact IRWD Customer Service or to follow a website link to enroll in a payment plan online. The letter further referred customers to the California's Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) administered by the Department of Community Services and Development (CSD) and other low-income assistance programs.

In 2022, IRWD participated in the California Water and Wastewater Arrearage Payment Program (CWWAPP). The CWWAPP program covered delinquent bills relating to water and wastewater services provided for the period March 4, 2020 through June 15, 2021. IRWD received approximately \$1.4 million for water bills and \$0.5 million for wastewater bills from the program. By mid-May 2022, IRWD had applied these funds to the delinquent accounts of approximately 3,900 customers.

<u>Update on Customers with Past-due Accounts:</u>

On July 30, 2022, IRWD sent notifications to all delinquent accounts that were not on a payment plan of its intent to resume its policy for charging late fees and discontinuing water service. Delinquent accounts are those that owe more than \$150, are over 60 days delinquent, and are not enrolled in a payment plan. Based on IRWD's policy for discontinuing water service, these customers are eligible for disconnection for non-payment. The July 30 notifications also included information on how these customers could enroll in a payment plan, if needed.

Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee: Resumption of IRWD Shutoff Policy Update

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Feedback has been mostly positive since the letter was sent, with many customers stating that they did not realize they had an outstanding balance due to IRWD. The following is a summary of customers responding to the communications sent to them by IRWD:

Next Steps:

Staff currently intends to resume IRWD's policy for applying late fees and interest charges beginning September 1, 2022. On October 1, 2022, shutoffs for delinquent accounts (not enrolled in a payment plans) will begin. As per normal practice, staff will ensure the appropriate noticing of customers subject to shutoff of water service.
