#### WATER RESOURCES AND POLICY AND COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE

#### 2022 LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY UPDATE

#### SUMMARY:

This report provides an update on the 2021-2022 legislative session, regulatory issues, and IRWD priorities. As legislation and regulations develop, staff will provide updates and recommendations to the Water Resources and Policy and Communications Committee and the Board, as appropriate. Staff recommends the Board consider the following actions/positions:

- AB 2357 (Ting) Surplus Land: "OPPOSE UNLESS AMENDED,"
- AB 2536 (Grayson) Impact Fee Nexus Studies: Connection fees and Capacity charges: "WATCH."
- ACR 180 (Bauer-Kahan) Special Districts Week: "SUPPORT," and
- SB 1345 (Ochoa Bogh) Excavations: Subsurface Installations: "OPPOSE UNLESS AMENDED."

#### BACKGROUND:

The months of April and May are a very busy time of year in Sacramento. The Legislature is active hearing and amending bills. The last day for legislative policy committees to hear fiscal bills introduced in their house to fiscal committees was April 29, 2022 while May 6 was the last day for legislative policy committees to hear non-fiscal bills introduced in their house. May 20 is the last day for fiscal committees to hear and report bills to the floor, and May 27 is the house of origin deadline.

#### 2022 State Budget:

The next significant milestone in the annual state budget process is the release of the Governor's May Revise, which is his update to the proposed budget he put forth in January. The May Revise will certainly update General Fund revenues, expenditures, and reserve estimates, and propose how to use the expected \$65 million increase in forecasted revenues. Staff will provide an update on the May Revise if is it released prior to the WRP Committee meeting.

Senate Budget Plan: Putting California's Wealth to Work for a More Equitable Economy:

With the May Revise expected in early May, on April 28, 2022, Senate President Pro Tempe Toni Atkins (D-San Diego) and Senate Budget and Fiscal Committee Chair Nancy Skinner (D-Berkeley) unveiled "Step #2: Detailed Senate Budget Priorities" of the Senate's "Putting Wealth to Work for a More Equitable Economy" budget plan. Step one of the <u>Senate Budget Plan</u>, which was released in December 2021, outlined of the key values the Senate wants the budget based one. Step #2 details the Senate's budget priorities.

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Step #2 of the "Putting Wealth to Work" plan increases forecasted stated revenues by \$65 billion (as compared to the Governor's January revenue forecast) and proposes a number of priority expenditures for that budget surplus. For example, the Senate's proposal would provide \$8 billion in "Better For Families Tax Rebates." The proposed rebate would provide \$200 per taxpayer plus \$200 for dependents for single filers making up to \$125,000, and joint filers making up to \$250,000. The purpose of the rebates is to help mitigate the impacts of high energy costs and other goods. The plan also proposes additional investments in infrastructure. The Senate budget plan proposes:

- \$20 billion for transportation;
- \$18 billion for climate infrastructure investments and capital outlay;
- \$2 billion in behavioral health facilities; and
- \$180 million to expand capacity and improved facilities for local food banks.

Of these categories, the Senate's \$18 billion climate infrastructure investments and capital outlay package has funding proposals of interest to IRWD. The climate proposal includes a \$6.6 billion Wildfire Package (over five years), \$3.3 billion for sea level rises (over multiple years), \$1 billion for disadvantage communities, \$1 billion for biodiversity and outdoor access for all, and a \$7.5 billion Water and Drought Package (state and federal funds). The Senate's Water and Drought Package includes the following components:

- \$2 billion to rebalance state water supply and water rights;
- \$1.5 billion to for safe drinking water;
- \$1.5 billion for improving watershed climate resilience regionally;
- \$1.5 billion Drought Resilient Water Supply grants, to assist with recycling, stormwater capture, and groundwater cleanup; and
- \$1 billion for Flood Management and Dam Safety grants to improve resilience of flood management system and fund public benefit portion of dam safety projects.

#### Assembly Budget Plan:

On May 3, the Assembly released its budget plan. The Assembly plan cites an expected \$63 billion to \$68 billion budget surplus. This plan lists the Assembly's budget approach as:

- Protecting promises by protecting existing programs from cuts and future Gann-limit impacts;
- Investing in the future by using one-time funding and prioritizing long-term infrastructure investments rather than short-term tax relief;
- Stabilizing schools by providing the new Proposition 98 funding in easy to count, flexible funding streams; and

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• Finishing the job by adopting the final component of CalGrant reform, fixing the child care rates impacted by transitional-kindergarten implementation, and raising CalWORKs families out of deep poverty.

The Assembly's proposed infrastructure investments include dam safety and seismic safety improvement, drought relief project funding, and continued wildfire prevention and climate change investments. In contrast with the Senate Budget Plan, few details are provided in the Assembly Budget Plan, and no proposed amounts of funding are proposed. While no additional detail is provided, the plan proposes to "expand drought funding, including water recycling and helping small farmers," and "begin needed investments in dam safety."

Staff will provide the WRP Committee with an update on the state budget process for the development of the 2022-23 Fiscal Year State Budget.

#### 2022 State Legislative Update:

AB 2357 (Ting, D-San Francisco) – Surplus land:

AB 2357 proposes to revise the rules related to local agencies' disposal of surplus land. The rules that govern a local agency's disposition of surplus land in California is known as the Surplus Land Act (SLA). Specifically, AB 2357 would revise the definition of "surplus land" within the Government Code and would restrict a special district's ability to dispose of land that is exempt from the SLA.

Specifically, AB 2357 would remove certain provisions the District negotiated for and obtained in AB 1486 (2019, Ting) related to a special district's disposal of "exempt surplus land" used for investment purposes or other agency use. The bill would require a special district to comply with the SLA when it is selling investment properties or property used for generation of revenue to further the district's work or operations.

AB 2357 would also require local agencies to notify the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) 30 days prior to disposing of exempt surplus land. The requirement to notify HCD prior to disposing of exempt surplus land would inappropriately place HCD in the middle of land transactions that are expressly exempt from the SLA.

Because the bill has the potential to impact IRWD's investment and real property transactions, IRWD currently has an "oppose unless amended" position on AB 2357 and authorizes staff to seek amendments to provisions of the SLA that apply to special districts.

AB 2536 (Grayson, D-Concord) – Impact Fee Nexus Studies: Connection fees and Capacity charges:

As previously reported, Assemblymember Grayson (D-Concord) has authored AB 2536, which, as introduced, would have impacted the District's ability to set and charge cost-of-service-based connection fees. The Board had adopted an "oppose" position on the bill and authorized staff to work to ensure that the District's ability to set cost-of-service-based connection fees was

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preserved. Staff worked with the District's associations and industry partners to seek amendments to AB 2536. Fortunately, the bill was amended on April 26, 2022, to remove the provisions of bill that threatened the District's ability to set cost-of-service-based connection fees.

Specifically, AB 2536 was amended to remove the proposed requirement for a local agency that imposes a fee or capacity charge to support the estimate the estimate of reasonable cost of providing service by following specified standards and practices. Those provisions were replaced with a requirement for a local agency to evaluate the amount of the fee or capacity charge prior to levying a new fee or capacity charge, and include evidence to support that the fee or capacity charge does not exceed the estimated reasonable cost of providing service. The bill also requires that the information constituting the evaluation be made publicly available at least 14 days prior to an open and public meeting held in accordance with existing law for levying a new fee or service charge. IRWD's existing practices meet the bill's evaluation requirements and staff is comfortable with making that evaluation available 14 days prior to the board meeting where the Board will consider the connection fees.

Staff recommends the Board adopt a "watch" position on AB 2536.

AB 2811 (Bennett, D-Santa Barbara) – California Building Standards Commission: Recycled water and Non-potable water systems:

As reported to the WRP Committee on April 7, Assemblymember Steve Bennett (D-Santa Barbara) has authored AB 2811, which would require all newly constructed nonresidential buildings of 100,000 square-feet or more to be constructed with onsite reuse systems and also require dual-plumbing and use of recycled water for all applicable non-potable water demands in newly constructed nonresidential buildings after January 1, 2024. The Board adopted an "oppose unless amended" position on AB 2811. The author subsequently pulled the bill from being heard by the committee and AB 2811 will not advance.

#### SB 1345 (Ochoa Bogh) – Excavations: Subsurface Installations:

SB 1345 revises the Dig Safe Act of 2016, and amends both operator and excavator responsibilities related to underground utilities and excavations. Most significantly, this bill would add non-pressurized sewer lines and storm drains to the definition of "subsurface installation."

Since 1989, the "Call Before You Dig" law, later updated by the "Dig Safe Act of 2016," has required an excavator to notify a regional notification center (commonly referred to as 811 centers because of the telephone number used to contact them) prior to planned excavations. The Act requires operators of subsurface installations to identify and mark underground infrastructure in the vicinity of a planned excavation. Subsurface installations include gas lines, electric lines, water mains, and communication cables. Non-pressurized sewer lines, non-pressurized storm drains, and other non-pressurized drain lines are exempt under current law. SB 1345 would change this.

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Staff recommends the Board adopt an "oppose unless amended" position on SB 1345 and authorize staff to seek amendments to the bill that remove non-pressurized sewer lines from the definition of subsurface installation. Striking a sewer line should not be expected to be hazardous to an excavator since they are non-pressurized, and the cost to operators to mark non-pressurized sewer lines would outweigh any potential benefit to public safety.

#### Other 2022 State Legislative Updates:

The following bills are also of interest to IRWD.

- SB 1157 (Hertzberg, D-Van Nuys) Indoor Residential Water Use Standard: SB 1157, as introduced, included the proposed indoor residential water use standards recommended by the Department of Water Resources (DWR). It would lower the indoor water use standard for residential water use from 52.5 gallons per capita daily (gpcd) to 47 gpcd beginning on January 1, 2025, and from 50 gpcd to 42 gpcd beginning on January 1, 2030. SB 1157 was passed by the Senate and is now in the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. IRWD has an "oppose unless amended" position on SB 1157; and
- ACR 180 (Bauer-Kahan, D-Orinda) Special Districts Week: Again this year, the California Special Districts Association is sponsoring an Assembly Concurrent Resolution proclaiming Special Districts week. ACR 180, authored by Assemblymember Rebecca Bauer-Kahan (D-Orinda), would proclaim May 15-21, 2022, to be Special Districts Week. As the District has done in previous years, staff recommends the Board adopt a "support" position on the Assembly Concurrent Resolution recognizing Special Districts Week.

Staff will also provide an oral update new developments related other legislative matters of interest to IRWD:

#### 2022 State and Regional Regulatory Update:

Proposed Text of Conservation Provisions of Emergency Regulation:

On March 28, Governor Newsom signed an executive order (EO) requiring the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) to consider adopting emergency regulations that require:

- Urban water suppliers to implement, at a minimum, Level 2 shortage response actions;
- A definition for "non-functional turf" and a ban on irrigation of non-functional turf in the commercial, industrial, and institutional sectors (CII) except as it may be required to ensure the health of trees and other perennial non-turf plantings; and
- Urban water suppliers to submit a preliminary annual water supply and demand assessment to DWR no later than June 1, 2022, and a final annual water supply and demand assessment no later than the existing statutory deadline.

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In response to the Governor's EO, on April 20, 2022, the State Board released a Working Staff Draft of Proposed Text of Conservation Provisions of Emergency Regulation, that:

- Requires urban water suppliers that have submitted a water shortage contingency plan to DWR to implement by June 10, 2022, at a minimum, the demand reduction actions identified in the supplier's water shortage contingency plan for a shortage level of up to twenty percent (Level 2);
- Defines "non-functional turf" as "turf that is solely ornamental and not regularly used for human recreational purposes or for civic or community events that does not include sports fields and turf that is regularly used for human recreational purposes or for civic or community events;"
- Prohibits the use of potable water for the irrigation of non-functional turf at CII sites, except to the extent necessary to ensure the health of trees and other perennial non-turf plantings or to the extent necessary to address an immediate health and safety needs;
- Defines CII to include homeowners' associations, common interest developments, community service organizations, and other similar entities, but does not include the residences of these entities' members or separate interests; and
- Requires urban water suppliers to submit a preliminary annual water supply and demand assessment to DWR no later than June 1, 2022, and a final water supply and demand assessment no later than the deadline set in existing law.

Staff participated in a State Board public webinar that provided an overview of the draft proposed regulation on April 21, 2022. The State Board intends to consider adoption of the emergency regulation by May 24, 2022, and for the emergency regulation to be in effect by June 10, 2022. Staff will discuss the proposed regulation with the Committee.

Advanced Clean Fleets Regulation Proposed Draft Regulation Language:

The Advanced Clean Fleets Regulation would, starting in 2024, require medium- and heavy-duty vehicles purchased for state and local government fleets to be zero-emissions vehicles (ZEVs). This regulation has been in development since the beginning of 2020. In advance of a May 4, 2022 public workshop, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) released revised "Proposed Draft Regulation Language for the Public Fleets Requirements of the Advanced Clean Fleets Regulation."

As was the case with the previous version of the draft regulation language, the latest version of the proposed draft regulation requires 50 percent of public agency medium- and heavy-duty purchases to be ZEVs starting January 1, 2024, and 100 percent starting on January 1, 2027, unless a limited exception applies. The regulations do allow, until January 1, 2035, plug-in hybrid vehicles (NZEVs) to be purchased in lieu of ZEVs if no new ZEVs are available.

District staff has worked to ensure that this regulation will not compromise the District's ability to provide the essential public services for which the District is responsible. Of specific interest has been ensuring that the regulation only requires a ZEV to be purchased when a ZEV that

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meets the agency's requirements for that vehicle is commercially available, that the regulation appropriately reflects the emergency response needs for vehicles in the fleets of providers of essential public services, and that considerations of the availability of sufficient electrical infrastructure are reflected in the regulation. The latest proposed draft regulation includes some of these provisions.

Staff will update the Committee on the draft regulation.

#### Other 2022 Regulation Updates:

The following is a list of some of the State regulations and agency reports staff is monitoring, tracking, or planning to engage in over the next three to 12 months. As the next drafts of the regulations or reports are released for public review and comment, staff will engage, as appropriate. Staff will also provide an oral update to the Committee on any new developments related to these regulations. The pending regulations, administrative actions and reports actively being tracked include the:

- Executive and regulatory actions on COVID-19;
- Executive and regulatory actions related to the drought;
- California Air Resources Board (CARB) AB 32 Climate Change Scoping Plan Update;
- CARB's Proposed Advanced Clean Fleets Regulation;
- CARB In-use Off-road Diesel-Fueled Fleets Regulation Amendments;
- California Fish and Wildlife California Endanger Species Act Petition for the steelhead;
- California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA) 30 x 30 California Implementation;
- CNRA's Water Resilience Portfolio Implementation;
- DWR's 2023 California Water Plan Update;
- DWR and the State Board's implementation of the "Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life" legislation;
  - DWR and the State Board's Indoor Water Use Study and Indoor Water Use Standard Recommendations;
  - o DWR's Outdoor Standard Recommendations;
  - DWR's Work Group on Commercial, Industrial, and Institutional (CII) performance measures; and
  - o State Board's Water Loss Performance Standards Regulations;
- State Board's development of a "Cross Connection Policy Handbook";
- State Board's Direct Potable Reuse regulations;
- State Board's actions on lead service lines;
- State Board's Draft Statewide Sanitary Sewer System General Order;

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- State Board's <u>Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resilience (SAFER) Drinking</u> Water Program;
- South Coast AQMD's PR 403.2 Fugitive Dust from Road Construction Projects; and
- South Coast AQMD's Cumulative Impacts from Air Toxics for CEQA Projects.

Staff will also provide the Committee with an update on other regulatory matters of interest to the District.

#### 2022 Federal Legislative and Regulatory Update:

IRWD's federal advocacy efforts in 2022 continue to largely focus on seeking federal funding for the Kern Fan Groundwater Storage Project and advocating for an increased funding authorization for the federal Water Storage Program. Staff will update the Committee on these efforts and will update the Committee on the ongoing efforts related to positioning the Kern Fan Groundwater Storage Project for federal funding, and other federal legislative and regulatory proposals of interest to the District.
