Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:

The Santiago Aqueduct Commission (SAC), owns and operates an approximately 12-mile-long transmission pipeline from the Metropolitan Water District's Santiago Lateral to the Baker Water Treatment Plant, located in the City of Lake Forest. The pipeline ranges in diameter from 54-inches to 39-inches and consists of five separate "reaches". The pipeline begins in Reach 1U at the Santiago Lateral and terminates in Reach 5U at the Baker Water Treatment Plant, which is a 28 million gallon per day drinking water plant that serves several south Orange County water agencies. The primary purpose of the pipeline is to convey untreated water from the Santiago Lateral to the Baker Water Treatment Plant for treatment.

In 2020, SAC confirmed that a portion of the Baker Pipeline, located just downstream of the Santiago Lateral Turnout OC-33 in Reach 1U, became partially exposed. The exposed portion of the pipeline is located within Santiago Creek in Irvine Regional Park.

	The pipeline was initially designed and constructed with about 6-feet of cover across the creek, but since its construction, it appears that the creek has widened by about 50-feet and lowered in depth by more than 7-feet, which has resulted in the exposure of about 35 linear feet of the upper portion of the pipeline.
	To address the existing pipeline exposure and to minimize the potential for future exposure of additional portions of the pipeline, a new 350-foot segment of 54-inch diameter pipeline will be constructed at a depth of about 10-feet along the existing pipeline alignment across the width of Santiago Creek. The pipeline segment will be welded steel, concrete mortar-lined and coated to match the material in the existing pipeline.
	SAC will prepare permit applications for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife and the Natural Communities Commission.
