Important Info Regarding Your Bill

Having trouble reaching us? We hear you!

Our phone system has been experiencing mechanical issues due to the high volume of calls from customers asking how to reduce water usage in addition to a large number of calls on the new rates which went into effect on July 1, 2015.

Why Did I Receive Two Bills?

In July, you should have received a bill for all usage ending June 30, 2015 at the old rates. Then, you should have received an additional bill on your regular monthly billing date for any usage since July 1, 2015. *This is not a duplicate billing*.

Why Did My Bill Go Up?

On July 1, your outdoor monthly water allocation became based on drought tolerant landscape irrigated with a water efficient system such as drip. It is no longer based on warm season turf.

If you maintain your old watering schedule and have a lawn, you will likely go over your water allocation and your water bill will go up.
