Top 3 Ways to Help the Drought

Did you know that 60% of a home's total water is used outdoors? Join your fellow Californians in reducing your water use. Look outdoors to save the most water.

Here are the top 3 ways you can save water:

Check Your Sprinklers

Watering your landscape efficiently is the biggest way to reduce your water usage. It is important to check your sprinklers for leaks and overspray—your sidewalks don't need to be watered.

Have you considered switching to rotating sprinkler nozzles? Rotating nozzles use 20% less water than standard sprinkler heads. IRWD currently offers a rebate for \$4 per nozzle. For more information, visit **irwd.com/calscape**.

Use Watering Schedule

Place this watering schedule near your sprinkler timer or give it to your gardener. Using this IRWD suggested watering schedule will help properly irrigate your yard using the least amount of water necessary.

Install WBIC Smart Timer

Be the most efficient person in your neighborhood—install a smart timer, or weather-based irrigation controller (WBIC). A smart timer is a weather-based irrigation controller that determines how much to water your landscape based on actual site specific weather conditions, such as temperature and humidity.

Suggested Weekly Watering Schedule		
Month	Grass	Trees, Shrubs & Groundcover
January	2 days, 2 cycles of 2 minutes	1 day, 2 cycles of 3 minutes
February	2 days, 2 cycles of 2 minutes	1 day, 2 cycles of 3 minutes
March	3 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes	2 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes
April	3 days, 2 cycles of 4 minutes	2 days, 2 cycles of 4 minutes
May	3 days, 3 cycles of 3 minutes	2 days, 3 cycles of 3 minutes
June	3 days, 2 cycles of 5 minutes	3 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes
July	4 days, 3 cycles of 3 minutes	2 days, 3 cycles of 4 minutes
August	4 days, 3 cycles of 3 minutes	2 days, 3 cycles of 4 minutes
September	4 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes	2 days, 2 cycles of 4 minutes
October	3 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes	2 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes
November	2 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes	1 day, 2 cycles of 4 minutes
December	2 days, 2 cycles of 2 minutes	1 day, 2 cycles of 3 minutes
