

Suggested Weekly Winter Irrigation Schedule

Month	Turfgrass	Tree, Shrubs & Groundcover	% Option**
January	2 days, 2 cycles* of 2 minutes each	1 day, 2 cycles* of 3 minutes each	30%
February	2 days, 2 cycles of 2 minutes each	1 day, 2 cycles of 3 minutes each	30%
March	2 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes each	2 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes each	50%

Always remember to turn water off before rains and let soil dry before turning water on again.

**The % option, either a button or a dial, permits the watering run times for all electric valves managed by a controller to be increased or decreased with just one adjustment by percentage

Irrigation tips 'n' tune-ups

Colorful California Friendly Shrubs to Plant this Winter

If you've been thinking about upgrading the shrubbery in your landscape or garden to more water-efficient plant varieties, now's a good time to take action. Winter is an optimum season for planting California Friendly shrubs. These plants thrive in our Mediterranean climate and can be inexpensively maintained for several reasons: once established, they use little or no water, they don't require elaborate soil conditioning or fertilizers and they're naturally pest-resistant. They also attract native wildlife like birds and butterflies. There are hundreds of attractive and easy-to-care-for California Friendly shrubs to choose from; here are five colorful non-invasive varieties for starters:



Cleveland sage

(Salvia clevelandii)

This California native has graceful silvery-green leaves, arching branches, and whorls of purple flowers that bloom between May and August. Grows up to 4 feet tall and wide. Requires full sun.



bush poppy and island bush poppy

(Dendromecon rigida and D. harfordii)

Beautiful yellow poppies cover this evergreen shrub that grows up to 6 feet tall or can be maintained at 3 feet. It is frequently used for backgrounds and large scale situations. Its leaves are blue-greygreen. Do not provide this shrub with summer water.



pineapple guava

(Acca sellowiana or Feijoa sellowiana)

This evergreen shrub has scarlet and white flowers, as delicious as they are beautiful, that produce waxy-green oval-shaped fruits with a minty-pineapple flavor. This plant can be pruned to almost any size or shape. Its foliage is gray-green and silvery underneath. Requires full sun.



toyon or Christmas berry

(Heteromeles arbutifolia)
Birds love the brilliant red berries that this 8 to15 foot-high California native evergreen shrub produces in large clusters from delicate white flowers. Toyon likes full sun or partial shade and tolerates heat, smog, wind and drought. It also can be pruned into a small tree.



lemonade berry (Rhus integrifolia)

A member of the Sumac family, lemonade berry is an evergreen shrub with berry-like seeds. Its leaves, like many drought-resistant plants, are tough and waxy. In blooming season, it has tiny 1/8 inch, white or rose-colored flowers with 5 petals. These flowers, which tend to grow in clusters, turn into red corn nut-sized berries that have a lemony scent. The lemonade berry blooms from February through May. This native shrub thrives best in coastal areas and can grow up to 30 feet in high.
