Do You Work for a WaterStar? New Program Recognizes and Rewards Local Water-Efficient Businesses

Irvine Ranch Water District's WaterStar Business Recognition Program helps local companies improve water use efficiency, save on water bills and obtain financial incentives for efficiency improvements. The program is open to IRWD commercial, industrial and institutional customers, including commercial landscape companies managing irrigation sites within the IRWD



service area. Eligible businesses and institutions can apply for WaterStar Program Certification any time throughout the year. Certification is good for three years.

Businesses who obtain WaterStar Certification earn the use of the WaterStar logo for display, web posting and advertising. These businesses will also receive an award, presented at an IRWD Board meeting, acknowledging their water conservation achievements.

It's No Sweat to Work on Saving Water

Many people spend much of their week working away from home. Consider these simple ways to contribute to a more water-efficient workplace:



Report indoor leaks. Common leaks such as dripping faucets and worn toilet flappers can contribute to major water waste in a building. A toilet leaking at 0.5 gallons per minute (gpm) can waste 21,600 gallons of water per month! Please report any leaks to your facility maintenance staff.



Watch out for outdoor waste. Up to 30 percent of the overall water use at your work place can go toward landscape maintenance. If you notice any broken sprinklers, overspray or other signs of water waste, inform your landscape maintenance team.



Install high-efficiency faucet aerators. IRWD offers up to 12 free faucet aerators per customer account for use in commercial property bathrooms. These efficient devices are easy to install and put out a fraction of the water used by traditional aerators.



Dish out water savings. When washing dishes in the office kitchen, fill the sink and turn off the tap. If your workplace kitchen has a dishwasher, only run it with full loads.

Q: If the weather heats up this fall, should I keep using the same amount of water that I used in August?

A: At this time of the year, even though the weather may feel warm, the days keep getting shorter. This means that you do not need to water as much as you did during the summer months. Plants adapt to less light by becoming less active and using less water in the fall. Please refer to our fall watering schedule (shown below) for details on how to more efficiently water your landscape.

Suggested Weekly Watering Schedule		
Month	Grass	Trees, Shrubs & Groundcover
October	3 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes	2 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes
November	2 days, 2 cycles of 3 minutes	1 day, 2 cycles of 3 minutes
December	3 days, 2 cycles of 2 minutes	1 day, 2 cycles of 3 minutes
