Bottled vs. Tap? Get the Facts

Bottled water last year surpassed soda as America's most popular beverage. It's a \$16-billion-a-year industry, marketing a product that—when purchased one bottle at a time—costs about \$6 per gallon, compared to two-tenths of a cent for a gallon of Irvine Ranch Water District tap.

Since both bottled and tap water meet regulatory standards, the choice is a matter of lifestyle, not health.

Here are some facts to consider:

- Tap water is economical and accessible, particularly with a travel bottle.
- 25% of all bottled water is packaged tap water.
- Plastic bottles produce waste: 85 million bottles are manufactured in the U.S. each day.
- Plastic bottles are made from petroleum—1.5 billion barrels every year and the production and shipping of them burns fossil fuels.



Make the most of your tap water:

- Drink it from a reusable glass or stainless steel travel bottle to reduce waste.
- Keep it in a pitcher in the fridge to chill it and let it breathe.
- Infuse it with slices of cucumber, lemon or berries for a healthy punch.
- If you use a filter, be sure to change it regularly. Carbon-based filters are breeding grounds for bacteria.

Are You Getting the Right Water Budget for Your Home?

IRWD water bills are based on a monthly water budget established for customers based on typical living conditions and water needs for their dwelling type. We base these calculations on: (1) a default number of residents in a home, (2) an estimated square feet of landscape area, and (3) the amount of water needed seasonally to irrigate the yard. (See graphic below for details.)

If your living situation exceeds the standard monthly allowance, we encourage you to apply for a variance, which can increase your water budget to account for circumstances such as additional people living in the home, special medical needs, and larger landscaped areas. Variances must be renewed annually. To apply, visit irwd.com/services/request-a-water-variance or call 949-453-5300.

Exceeding Your Water Budget?

If you are using more than your monthly water budget, you can request a free water efficiency home audit to find out why. Frequent causes include water leaks, broken sprinkler timers, leaky toilets or broken irrigation systems. Call 949-453-5300.

Q: I have to replant a hill in my backvard. It is 15 feet high and fairly steep. In the past 46 years, it was planted first with African Daisies, and later with Red Apple succulent. Can you suggest any ground covers that flower and are drought tolerant?

A: African Daisies and Red Apple are considered drought-tolerant or medium-water-use plants so replanting them wouldn't be a bad choice. However, if you'd like to try something different, I'd suggest the Arthur Menzies Seaside Daisies (Erigeron Arthur Menzies) or the Emerald Carpet Manzanita (Arctostaphylos Emerald Carpet). There are also many other great groundcover choices to consider. Visit rightscaperesources.com or the California Native Plant Society's website (cnps.org/gardening) to determine what works best for your landscape.
