Q: Hello! The crows are completely ruining my lawn by pulling up grass to get to bugs. Is there anything I can do?

A: It sounds like you might have beetle grubs. I recommend you look for an eco-safe product to spray on the lawn. Environmentally sound brands of pest-control products use essential oil blends to get rid of insects and other pests. These products are usually pet and people friendly. Consult with a garden store like Armstrong

Garden Centers for assistance. Synthetic chemical products are available too, but please do some research and be careful before using them.

Also, certain plants help keep bugs and other pests away. For example: marigolds, chrysanthemums, and herbs such as lavender, chai and bay leaves. Rosemary is common to protect against a wide variety of bugs for vegetable plantings.

California Native CornerJuan's December Plant: Christmas Berry

Christmas berry (*Heteromeles arbutifolia*), also known as toyon, produces numerous bright red pea size berries which birds go crazy for in the fall and winter. It has dark green leathery leaves that are sharply toothed. Because it resembles a holly bush with its toothed leaves and red berries, Hollywood was named for this native plant. It's the perfect landscape plant because it is easy to grow, can be trained as a small tree, does well in any
