Q: We have a lot of grass and are trying to find some alternative ground coverings. Can you recommend some low-growing, drought-tolerant coverage to replace turf?

A: Many ground covers come to mind, such as silver carpet (*Dymondia margaretae*) and lantana. Some are low-growing and some flower. If you are interested in something that can take foot traffic and is

water thrifty, kurapia is a good plant to consider. Take a look first-hand at the demonstration garden at IRWD Headquarters, 15600 Sand Canyon Ave., Irvine.

California native corner Juan's February plant: blue-eyed grass

Blue-eyed grass (*Sisyrinchium bellum*) grows throughout California, particularly in open, grassy areas. The flowers are purplish-blue and occasionally white. The plant prefers some moisture and good drainage, but also tolerates summer dryness. Blue-eyed grass is easy
