



#### Q: Hi Juan! Do you have any recommendations for fragrant plants I can plant in my garden?

A: Gardenias are amazingly fragrant and do well in full sun and partial shade, and fragrant sweet box is excellent for shady areas. Better yet, consider these California native plants: The shade-loving Catalina perfume makes an excellent shrub for any garden, with aromatic foliage and tiny clove-like scented flowers. The mock orange produces delicious citrus-scented

flowers, while the foliage of the coyote mint gives off a mint-like fragrance.

Don't forget about the many sweet-smelling sages, including hummingbird sage and white sage, used among indigenous peoples for their fragrant, medicinal and spiritual attributes. Happy planting!

#### Juan's March plant: creeping snowberry

Creeping snowberry (Symphoricarpos mollis) makes an excellent low-growing and spreading accent shrub. A member of the honeysuckle family, it does well in arid areas and grows best near the coast, tolerating full sun to shady areas. The pink flower

# Q: I found a leak in my toilet, and fixed it. Can I get a break on my bill?

A: A higher water bill is frequently a sign that you have a leak. They may seem insignificant but, over time, leaks can add up to hundreds of gallons of water.

IRWD is happy to adjust your bill when leaks are found and repaired, provided your water use goes back to levels within your water allocation. You'll still need to pay for the water you used, but at a much lower rate.

If next month's bill shows you're back within your water budget, contact Customer Service, explain your situation, and we'll rebill what was charged in the "inefficient" and "wasteful" tiers at the lower "base" rate.
