

Q: Juan, I need to mulch an area in my yard measuring about 800 square feet. How much mulch should I buy?

A: Mulch, mulch, beautiful mulch. There's a simple formula for that: square footage, times depth in inches, divided by 324. That calculation will give you the cubic yards of mulch you need.

In your case, 800×3 is 2,400, divided by 324 equals 7.4 cubic yards of mulch.

California native corner Juan's February plant: Desert globemallow

Native to the southwestern states and northern Mexico, desert globemallow (*Sphaeralcea ambigua*) is a fuzzy, pale-green-leaved perennial with colorful orange cup-shaped flowers that bloom intermittently throughout the year to attract pollinators. Plant it in full sun in a variety of soils, and water it lightly in summer. Growing up to 4 feet tall, it can also make a striking potted plant.
