
It's inevitable: If you pour fats, oils and grease down your kitchen drain, you will eventually wind up with a stopped-up sink.

Q: Hi Juan. My Western redbud is really overgrown. Do you have any pruning tips?

A: Sounds like your tree's going for the wild look. The best time to tame it is in winter, before spring growth kicks in. That way, it heals quickly and comes back strong. Just don't go overboard. Sloppy pruning can mess up its shape and cause problems down the road. Focus on trimming dead, damaged, or crowded

branches. When you prune, think about thinning out rather than heading back. Thinning removes entire branches to open the canopy, while heading back just shortens them. Thinning is usually better for the tree's health and structure. Done right, pruning keeps your tree thriving and looking sharp.

Bush poppy (*Dendromecon rigida*) is a vigorous evergreen shrub native to Southern and Baja California, producing brilliant, fragrant yellow blooms in winter and spring.
