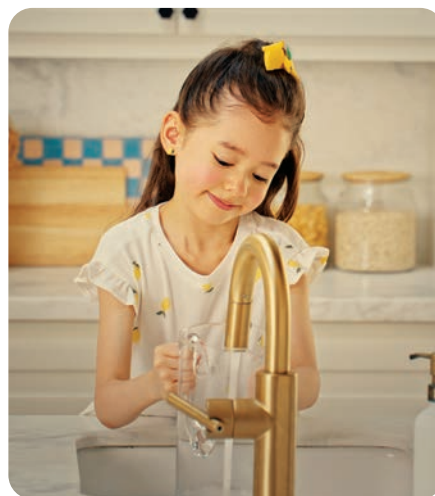

It's time to dial back your timer

Don't let the heat fool you about your landscape. September is the time to reduce your irrigation schedule by 30%.

The days are getting shorter, so less water is lost through evaporation, and the soil does a better job of retaining the water you give it. Plants are also entering a period of dormancy — so they don't need as much water.

Adjust for these changes by dialing down your watering schedule. If you ran your irrigation three times a week in August, try running it twice a week this month. You'll still have a beautiful yard and save water and money, too.

Q: Hi, Juan. I love the look of a gravel pathway and want to put one in myself. Do you have any tips?

A: Gravel is an excellent choice! It promotes good drainage, is easy to install and affordable. I recommend crushed stone. It comes in various colors and sizes, but I prefer the finer grain size. Start by removing vegetation and digging down a few inches to accommodate the material you'll be adding. Install landscape fabric to block

weeds, and be sure to add edging to keep the gravel in place. All this will ensure a long-lasting pathway that filters water into the soil and is perfect for any sustainable garden design.

California native corner Juan's September plant: Fairy duster

Fairy duster (*Calliandra eriophylla*) is a low-spreading deciduous desert shrub producing dense clusters of vibrant deep- to pale-pink powderpuff flowers in spring and summer. It can tolerate extreme drought but does better with small amounts of water in the summer. It is a hummingbird and pollinator magnet, great for any water-friendly garden.



Q: We were granted a water variance when my parents moved in with us. Will I need to renew that?

A: IRWD assigns each customer account a water budget using a baseline number of residents and a default landscape area typical for the property type: a house, attached home or condo or apartment.

In cases like yours, where the number of residents exceeds the base number, a variance increases the home's water budget to accommodate the water needs of everyone living there.

Because customers frequently have changes in occupancy, we require these variances to be renewed annually. Landscape variances do not require annual renewal because the conditions in a yard are more stable. Go to [IRWD.com/variance](https://www.irwd.com/variance) for details.
