## Wild spaces, happy faces.

### Build a backyard environment for kids to play, explore and learn.

Lawns are just a sea of green—static and unremarkable. Why not create a space for your children that fosters curiosity, engagement and social connection—all of which are vital to early childhood development?

Elements such as natural playground equipment, sensory gardens and imaginative sitting areas encourage children to explore sounds, experience textures, develop their eyebrain coordination and build a stronger connection with the natural world.

Design your yard with safety and inclusivity in mind. Ensure that it suits the ages and abilities of the children who will play there, so they all can fully benefit from the experience.



Consider something as simple as a tree stump or rock stepping-stone path with log balance beams alongside a small garden with California-appropriate plants that stimulate sight, smell, sound, touch and even taste. Add to that a natural outdoor classroom, art space or reading area.

For safety, opt for impact-absorbing surface materials like nontoxic shredded rubber mulch, and choose forgiving seat materials made from soft, durable materials rather than wood or metal.

Be sure to carefully assess the area for tripping hazards and ensure that all equipment aligns with the appropriate age group, preventing accidents while promoting enjoyable and developmentally enriching experiences.

## Juan's tip of the season.

### **Protect plants from summer scorch.**

Too much sun and heat can stress your landscape and vegetable garden. Your best line of defense is the "right plant, right place" principle of selecting landscape plants that can thrive in direct sunlight.

For your veggie garden, set up a temporary shade structure to protect plants during peak midday and afternoon sun and heat.

Keep your plants well-watered, and apply mulch to help retain soil moisture and lower soil temperatures. These simple steps significantly boost plant health. A little care makes a big difference!



Your garden to-do list.

 Check your irrigation system: Watch for clogged nozzles, and replace nozzle filters if needed. For drip systems, flush your drip filters and check for clogged or broken lines.

- Clean up your landscape: Remove spent flowers and damaged or diseased stems, branches and foliage. Clear out weeds and apply mulch if needed.
- Optimize lawn watering: Water only in early morning to reduce evaporation, and raise your mower height: Longer grass blades shade the soil and save water.
